Position on Risk Management

Pi Lambda Phi follows the Fraternity Information and Programming Group's (FIPG) Policy on risk management. Pi Lambda Phi offers numerous educational materials, from web based knowledge centers, to interactive programs. All members of the new chapter will complete a Risk Management education course facilitated by Headquarters staff. This course introduces them to FIPG and highlights the guidelines they will be expected to follow. Brothers of the fraternity will then be expected to complete refresher risk management courses per semester to ensure understanding and compliance.

In addition to online content, we actively work with our chapters to address risk management issues before they become violations. Chapter officers are encouraged to ask about situations that may result in less than adequate safety for members and guests. This creates an open door policy that prevents various risk management "surprises." Pi Lambda Phi also invests in educating the alumni and advisory board to provide a local level of support. Our risk management policy and proper procedures for managing risks are addressed at every regional and national conference we host.

If a chapter has a risk management violation, they are given due process during an International Executive Council hearing. A copy of Pi Lambda Phi's disciplinary process can be received upon request.
